#### **Commodores Column - APRIL**



Greetings from the Commodore

Welcome back! Thank you for reading...

This past month we held an event in Bremerton celebrating the "Eagles Tribute Band". The celebration was very well attended by 22 people on nine boats. Dennis and Bryn were the gracious hosts and did a fantastic job. Highlights included a chili cook off on Friday night and Mexican food at a local restaurant in Port Orchard before the concert on Saturday night. Apparently, the tribute band was excellent and everyone there "Took It Easy" and did not "Take it to the Limit".

This month we celebrate the start of boating season. I took the liberty to do a little research on the origins of boating. According to literature the history of boats is older than history and the earliest evidence of writing in any civilization. The earliest boats were not built by modern humans but by their predecessors, the Homo Erectus about 800,000 years ago and this is how they probably spread from Africa to the other parts of the world. Archaeological data states that the oldest boat in the world dates back to 8200-7600 BC. It is called the Pesse canoe and was discovered in the Netherlands. It was a three-feet long dugout, meaning it was made from a hollowed bark of the Pinus Sylvestris tree. However, experts believe that boats were very much in use before

that as well. This can be gauged from the earliest depiction of a ship on a rock carving in Azerbaijan dating back to 10,000 BCE! It showed a reed rowing ship carrying about 20 men.

Need a new burgee or your boat or tender? Let us know the size you need and we'll get it ordered.

Don't know the correct size for you country when flying the US Flag?

For a sailboat, one-half inch on the fly for each foot of masthead height above the water. For a power boat, five-eighths inch on the fly for every foot of overall length of the craft.

Do you know the proper use of a courtesy flag for a foreign country? When entering a foreign country you are supposed to fly a yellow flag (Quarantine) from the border to the customs dock.

Once cleared by Customs, you fly that country's courtesy flag

When reentering the US you are suppose to remove the foreign courtesy flag!




