As of January 1st, 2025, the new law requiring that boaters stay 1,000 yards away from Southern Resident killer whales went into effect. Boaters also must stay 200 yards away from other killer whales such as Biggs and Transient killer whales. This law is intended to allow the whales to forage and rest with minimal disturbance.

A note of interest is that Southern Residents feed primarily on Salmon while the Transients feed on Sea Mammals such as Seals and Sea Lions.

How we should be able to tell the difference between Southern Residents and Transients eludes me however, the recommendation is to treat all killer whales as if they are Southern Residents.

We all wish our snowbirds a safe and speedy migration to their respective nests in Arizona and elsewhere. We will miss you!


