Ahoy HHYC!

The PNW boating season is nigh! In about 2 weeks the unofficial boating season begins with the Tacoma Yacht Club's Daffodil Festival. Right on the heels of that, in the first week of May is Seattle Yacht Club's official Opening Day week; culminating on May 3rd.

Many yacht clubs from around the Salish Sea will be venturing into Portage Bay for parades, rowing regattas and crew races, log booms, myriad parties on "Dock Zero," picnics, and all manner of fun and frivolity! Joy!

Boating has been part of living in the Pacific Northwest since time immemorial, and SYC's Opening Day, (considered one of the biggest celebrations of boating anywhere in the United States), has been a big deal for more than a century. Its inauspicious beginning was in 1895, when SYC was just three years old; and was comprised of a cheesy naval battle reenactment coinciding with that year's Independence Day celebrations.

In 1920 SYC relocated from West Seattle and built the facility which still stands on Portage Bay. The timing made sense because the Ballard and Montlake Cut had recently been completed. When that first "big" Opening Day was held in 1920, World War 1 had recently ended, and the Spanish Flu pandemic had finally subsided. Seattle boaters were ready to celebrate!

Participation grew steadily in the 1920s, and Opening Day was held each year throughout the <u>Great Depression</u> and even during World War II, though festivities and participation during the war years were curtailed somewhat by the absence of so many boaters who were serving overseas. Following victory in Europe and Asia, the first post-war Opening Day in 1946 is believed to have been one of the largest in the event's history.

Today, Opening Day is still a big deal, and SYC is poised again this year to welcome hundreds of boats and thousands of land-bound visitors to usher in another season of the best cruising anywhere on earth. 

Event Descriptions

Rendezvous

Is a boating event with hosts. The hosts provide marina information, create an agenda including activities & coordinate meals for the weekend (fees may apply).

Please note, slips have been saved but they are **not reserved** so be sure and call the marina as early as possible to guarantee your slip is reserved (reference HHYC).

Fleet Captain Events

Can be a land or boating event organized by the Fleet Captain . They give the details of the event, provide information on land or marinas, and coordinate the activities.

Commodore's Cruise

Summer cruise by the Commodore. A cruising schedule is shared, but you create your own schedule & make your marina reservations. You have the option to join in and out according to your personal schedule.

Many Marinas Fill up early - so make reservations soon!
