Ahoy HHYC!

Yay! Opening Day of boating season is upon us! Indeed, many of us have been cruising around the Salish Sea right along, but with this weeks Seattle Yacht

Club hosted events, boaters from around our fair waters will convene for all manner of water-based festivities and frivolity to kick off the 2025 season.

With the new season, of course, comes some changes in which we all need to be aware. Notable this year are updates to both Washington State and British Columbia regulations regarding Marine Mammals. These new regulations most significantly impact Southern Resident Killer Whale (SRKW), but also apply to other denizens of the deep. As joyful and responsible boaters, and caring representatives of HHYC, it is important we understand and comply with the new rules.

Most marine mammals in the Salish Sea are listed as "endangered" or "threatened" species. A few exceptions include Harbor Seals, Stellar Sea Lions and Harbor Porpoises. Humpback Whales, Gray Whales, and ALL orcas are considered endangered. The major news this year, starting January 1st 2025 affect SRKWs, and can be summarized as such: "Do not intentionally approach SRKWs within 1000 yards". How do you tell a SRKW from the "Biggs Killer Whales" (BKW's)? Not very easily; so it's a good idea to treat all orcas the same, and stay 1000 yards away.

If you find your fine vessel within 1000 yards, but less that ½ mile, simply move farther away. If you spot killer whales within ½ mile, but more than 400 yards, reduce speed to 7 knots, and move away. If the whales sneak up on you within 400 yards, disengage your engines, wait until they are at least 400 yards away; then move away. Note that these rules apply to all watercraft, including sailboats and paddle boats.

We are told that NOAA (assuming they haven't been DOGE'd out of existence) and WDFW will be patrolling and enforcing the new laws; but the initial focus will be on education. Nonetheless, if egregious violations occur, citations can be issued.

In addition to the new regulations, there is a "voluntary" no-go zone extending ¼ mile out from the western shore of San Juan Island from Cattle Point to Mitchell Bay. This increases to ½ mile near the Lime Kiln lighthouse.

To make things really confusing, in BC the rules are different! They make no distinction between SRKW's and BKW's, and from Campbell River to Ucluelet, stay 400 meters away. North of Campbell river stay 200 meters away. Also in BC there are two "Mandatory Interim Sanctuary Zones" at the southern edge of the Gulf Islands (just north of the San Juan's) from June 1-November 30th. The Canadian Coast Guard does patrol and enforce these zones, so best to respect the rules. If, indeed, the USA annexes Canada as the 51st state, it may simply our boating lives a bit in the future.

There is more info available at bewhalewise.org, and I encourage you to familiarize yours elves with the latest rules and affected areas. In the meantime, Kim and I wish you all a safe and enriching 2025 boating season, and we look forward to seeing you on the water.




